- Choose one of the following classes: CMTY 195, ECON 195, HIST 195, POL 195, SOC 195, SW 195
- To take advantage of "double counting" choose a diversity class from this area.
- Refer to the General Ed Program Check List for the appropriate choice of classes.
- Choose one of the following classes: CMTY 111, 470, ETHS 201,205,210,215, HIST 109, HURL 102,105, SOC 268
- A 2.40 GPA and 12 earned credits are the pre-requisites for this class.

7. University Elective is a class that you choose outside your major field of study. This class is usually in an area that holds high interest for you or would compliment your major. Examples of this for a business major may be a psychology class, a political science class, or a golf class.
8. This class is required for all SCSU students.
9. Choose one of the following classes: MKTG 333, ENGL 332, CMST 321, 332, 335, 341, 422, 432, 441
10. Accounting 380 is a pre-requisite or "co-requisite" to Accounting 381. That is, it should be taken before or concurrently with Accounting 381.
11. Choose from: ACCT 444, 481, 483, 484, 487, 490, BCIS 350, 443 or one 300 or 400 level course from BCIS, FIRE, MGMT, MKTG and 400 level ECON.
12. If a student is planning on being licensed as a CPA they will have to complete 150 semester hours of classes. Three of the options available to the student are obtaining a Masters in Business Administration (33cr); adding a major in Finance, BCIS, or Communications; or adding a business minor (15cr).
