Notes:

1. Math 196 requires a placement exam prior to registering for the class.
2. Choose one of the following classes: CMTY 195, ECON 195, HIST 195, POL 195, SOC 195, SW 195
3. To take advantage of "double counting" choose a diversity class from this area.
4. Refer to the General Ed Program Check List for the appropriate choice of classes.
5. Choose one of the following classes: CMTY 111, 470, ETHS 201,205,210,215, HIST 109, HURL 102,105, SOC 268
6. A 2.40 GPA and 12 earned credits are the pre-requisites for this class.
7. University Elective is a class that you choose generally outside your major field of study. This class is usually in an area that holds high interest for you or would compliment your major. Examples of this for a business major may be a psychology class, a political science class, or a golf class.
8. This class is required for all SCSU students.
9. Choose one of the following classes: MKTG 333, ENGL 332, CMST 321, 332, 335, 341, 422, 432, 441.
10. International Business electives approved by adviser.

11. The international business major requires certification of a threshold level of competence in one foreign language. This level normally can be attained by satisfactorily completing one year of 200-level sequence of courses or by passing an examination administered through the foreign languages and literature department, which will provide a certification of competence to the records office prior to graduation.
