

BAS Aviation Maintenance Management: 82 Credits in Major

Suggested Plan of Study

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Program advisors:

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This emphasis is designed to provide a cooperative articulated bachelors degree for students completing an aviation maintenance or avionics certificate/diploma program at a Technical college. The program includes the regular SCSU general education components, and aviation and management components to enhance the academic qualifications of the graduates and provide for career advancement. **Forty credits will be accepted in transfer for a maintenance or avionics certificate/diploma completed at a regionally accredited post secondary school, which may only be applied to this program.** Credits approved in the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum will also be counted towards the SCSU general education requirements.

Notes:

1. Where a choice is indicated the student should select one and then complete the other listed one the next semester.
2. Racial Issues course (3 credits) must be completed no later than end of first year in attendance. Take 2 other (6 credits) Diversity courses for a total of three (9 credits).
3. Take a balance of aviation, general education and other courses over a particular semester. Ensure you take at least two classes from the left side of each General Education area A-B-C.
4. Students focusing on Airport Management need to complete AVIT 409, 413, and 429. Students focusing on Airline Management need to complete AVIT 411, 413, and 423.
5. Needs to relate to aviation focus area as such you must have completed substantial coursework in your area of study.
6. Students desiring to major in Aviation must complete AVIT 101, 103, ENGL 191, CMST 192 and MATH 112, 211 with a grade of "C" or better no-later-than their first two years at SCSU; transfer students during their first year at SCSU. Students must declare the aviation major no later than the start of their Junior year (61 credits); transfer students at the end of their first year at SCSU. Students must complete course prerequisites before attempting the next course. Overrides into courses that students have not completed the prerequisite courses will not be allowed. Students must complete credit-by-exams prior to the end of their second semester at SCSU otherwise they must take the course in a regular class session. Classes (100/200 level) taken at two-year institutions which are offered at the 300/400 level at SCSU may be accepted, but will not count as upper division course work to meet the SCSU 45 credits requirement. No course substitutions are allowed if a student changes from one Aviation emphasis to another. On-campus SCSU students who desire to take on-line Aviation courses must get their adviser and department chair's written approval; students should be aware their expectations might not be matched with the actual experience. Students must meet with their adviser in the first semester to discuss the department's computer literacy policy; a signed copy of the document must be presented to their adviser for file at the time they apply for the Aviation major. AVIT 407 or AVIT 419 satisfies the Upper Division writing requirement.
